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The collection contains fourteen paperback books written by Shakespeare and used by Robert Panara to teach Shakespearean plays to the deaf. The paperbacks have his notes written in the margins. Robert Panara is recognized as one of the founders of the National Theatre of the Deaf. He was the only deaf member of the National Advisory Board, and the first NTID faculty member. He was also awarded the RIT Founders Award for his lifetime of achievement and devoted service to RIT. Panara retired from NTID in 1987.
