These papers were separated into two collections; one went to West Virginia and Regional Historical Collection of the University Libraries at West Virginia University, Morgantown, West Virginia. Mr. Miller served as RIT's president from Oct. 1, 1969 – Dec. 31, 1978. Upon his retirement, The Paul A. Miller Professorship in Adult and continuing Adult Education at RIT was established.
