Paula Grcevic was born deaf in Ohio, lived in Italy for part of her childhood, then moved to Connecticut and graduated high school. She earned her BFA in Communication Arts and her MFA in Printmaking/Stained Glass from Pratt Institute. She started teaching at NTID in 1979 and was the first NTID professor to win the Eisenhart Award for Outstanding Teaching more than once (1992 and 2006). This collection is comprised of multiple donations from Grcevic, including Russian papers related to deaf/deafness, art located in NTID/Dyer, and articles about the Gallaudet new president scandal.
