Collection is a donation from the late Stanley Witmeyer, a 1936 graduate of Rochester Athenaeum and Mechanics Institute (RAMI), and a longtime faculty member in the visual arts programs. Witmeyer lived 98 years (1913-2011) and remained devoted to RIT until his death. He played basketball for RAMI, served as head of the Alumni Association, and was nominated for an Outstanding Alumni award. Witmeyer graduated from RIT in 1936, received his B.A. in Education from Buffalo State in 1939 and an MFA from Syracuse University in 1946. After teaching in Cuba, NY for five years and serving in World War II, he joined RIT in 1946. He remained for 32 years as Director and Associate Dean of the Art School/College. He was an outstanding basketball player for RIT, Buffalo State, and The Rochester Seagrams. Over his life he received numerous awards including most recent, R.I.T. Retiree of the Year and the Rochester Arts Council Special Citation. The collection was deposited in the Archives by Bob Witmeyer, Stanley's son.

- Stanley Witmeyer 14"x17" Sketchbook containing color illustrations and photographic collage, appears to be primarily related to proposed campus improvements.
- Ralph Avery Reproductions- 6 reproductions of Ralph Avery work related to downtown Rochester
- Minted copper colored coin with text on one side of the coin that reads "Worlds Columbian Exposition in commemoration of the Four Hundredth Anniversary of the Landing of Columbus – MDCCCXCII – MDCCCXCIII" In a smaller text box is the text "Rochester Athenaeum & Mechanical Inst." Around the text on this side of the coin are two angels, one with an instrument, whereas the other has a pen and paper writing on a globe between the two angels. Off to the side of the coin are dual torches and at the bottom of the coin is a ship. Below the ship is the text "C.E.
